

## Pupil Premium Funding

What is Pupil Premium?

Pupil Premium Grant (PPG) is the additional funding allocated to schools in England to raise the attainment of disadvantaged children and close the gap between them and their peers. Specifically the Pupil Premium money is provided for those pupils who have been on Free School Meals (FSM) at any point over the past 6 years or those children who have been looked after continuously for at least 6 months. There is also a smaller provision of £300 made for those pupils who have a parent in the armed services. Schools have the freedom to spend the funding in a way they think is best to raise the attainment for the most vulnerable pupils, and narrow the gap between the highest and lowest achieving pupils.

At Wallsend Jubilee Primary School, this funding has been used to support a range of strategies which enable us to meet the needs of this group of pupils:

- A care guidance and support leader who supports families in challenging circumstances and who can help them to access external support through North Tyneside Early Help Assessment
- One to one tuition and small group intervention
- Part time intervention teacher
- Numicon Intervention Programme and additional Maths training for all staff
- Read, Write Inc. "Fresh Start" intervention for Literacy
- Additional part time teaching assistant to support in lower Key Stage 2
- Dedicated allocation of support staff timetables to support pupil premium pupils
- Year 6 Maths and Literacy booster classes
- Better Reading Programme and staff training
- 1<sup>st</sup> class @ number intervention and staff training
- Additional provision for out of school clubs to enable disadvantaged children to access high quality enrichment clubs

The impact of our Pupil Premium funding can be seen in our results across the school. Recent analysis has shown the positive impact this intervention has brought to individual children. We are starting to narrow the gap in each year group. Data analysis shows that our year 6 children, eligible for pupil premium, made better progress than the national average in reading and mathematics and slightly below in writing (1 pupil not making expected progress). In addition children exceeding the expected progress was far higher than the national figure in reading and mathematics.

The Governing Body are clear about the impact that the pupil premium funding is having on pupils' performance.

#### Pupil Premium Grant for 2015/2016: £115,140

At Wallsend Jubilee Primary School, we continue to ensure that teaching and learning opportunities meet the needs of all our pupils. Through frequent monitoring we ensure that appropriate provision is made for all disadvantaged pupils. We believe the targeted and strategic spending of our Pupil Premium allocation will support us in achieving our goals. Pupil premium funding represents a significant proportion of our budget and we are committed to ensuring it is spent to maximum effect. This includes investment in both academic and pastoral initiatives. Our focus for pupil premium spending in 2015/2016 will be allocated as follows:

- Quality first teaching is a key method for ensuring that the needs of those identified as being in receipt of pupil premium are met on a daily basis. We have raised the profile of Pupil Premium pupils across the school, ensuring all staff are fully aware of the pupils in their class to whom this applies. The aim is to narrow the gap between those in receipt of pupil premium and those not.
- A care guidance and support leader who supports families in challenging circumstances and who can help them to access external support through North Tyneside Early Help Assessment
- One to one tuition and small group intervention

- The release of senior teaching staff to lead high quality interventions with the aim of closing the gap between our disadvantaged children and their peers
- Part time intervention teacher
- Numicon Intervention Programme
- Read, Write Inc. “Fresh Start” intervention for Literacy
- Additional part time teaching assistant to support in lower Key Stage 2
- Dedicated allocation of support staff timetables to support pupil premium pupils
- Year 6 Maths and Literacy booster classes
- Better Reading Programme and staff training
- 1<sup>st</sup> class @ number intervention and staff training
- 1st class @ writing intervention and staff training
- Success @ arithmetic intervention and staff training
- A senior Leader for Accelerating Progress who monitors the progress of this group of children. Information is shared with all staff, where action plans are created to address the needs of our disadvantaged pupils
- Additional provision for out of school clubs to enable disadvantaged children to access high quality enrichment clubs
