



<p><u>Science</u> In the first half of the summer term, we will be looking at properties of materials. We will be discussing solids, liquids and gasses, natural and man-made materials and organic and inorganic materials. In the second half-term we will be moving on to changes in materials. In this unit, we will carry out a number of experiments that show how we can change a material's state. We will discuss key terms such as evaporation and condensation and reversible and irreversible changes.</p>	<p><u>Maths</u> Maths setting will continue during the summer term. During this period, we will continue to cover units from the different elements of mathematics: number and place value, addition, subtraction, multiplication and division, fractions and shape. This term we will heavily focus on reasoning, communicating and problem solving. We be introducing children to more complex worded problems where they will be required to apply skills they have learned in previous lessons to real-life situations. <p><u>PE</u> Outdoor PE will consist of athletics and rounders this term. We will focus on a number of track and field events and break down the skills needed to be successful in these areas. We will also continue to use ICT lessons for research and publishing purposes. Children will also learn how to sort data.</p>
<p><u>Theme</u> During the summer term, our focus for theme lessons will be Europe. Within this topic, we will cover curriculum areas of geography, history, art, music and design and technology. Over the course of the two half-terms we will focus on a number of European countries, locate them on the map, research their famous landmarks, think about their cultures and traditions and produce artwork in the style of famous artists from that country. Children are encouraged to research Europe at home and share information during theme lessons.</p>	<p><u>Literacy</u> During the summer term, we will consolidate the literary skills we have learned over the course of the year and remind ourselves of how to use these in context. We will be reading Treasure Island by Robert Louis Stevenson as part of our classic literature unit. As well looking at narrative poetry including the Highway man. We will continue to cover more complex elements of spelling, grammar and punctuation in basic skills lessons.
